

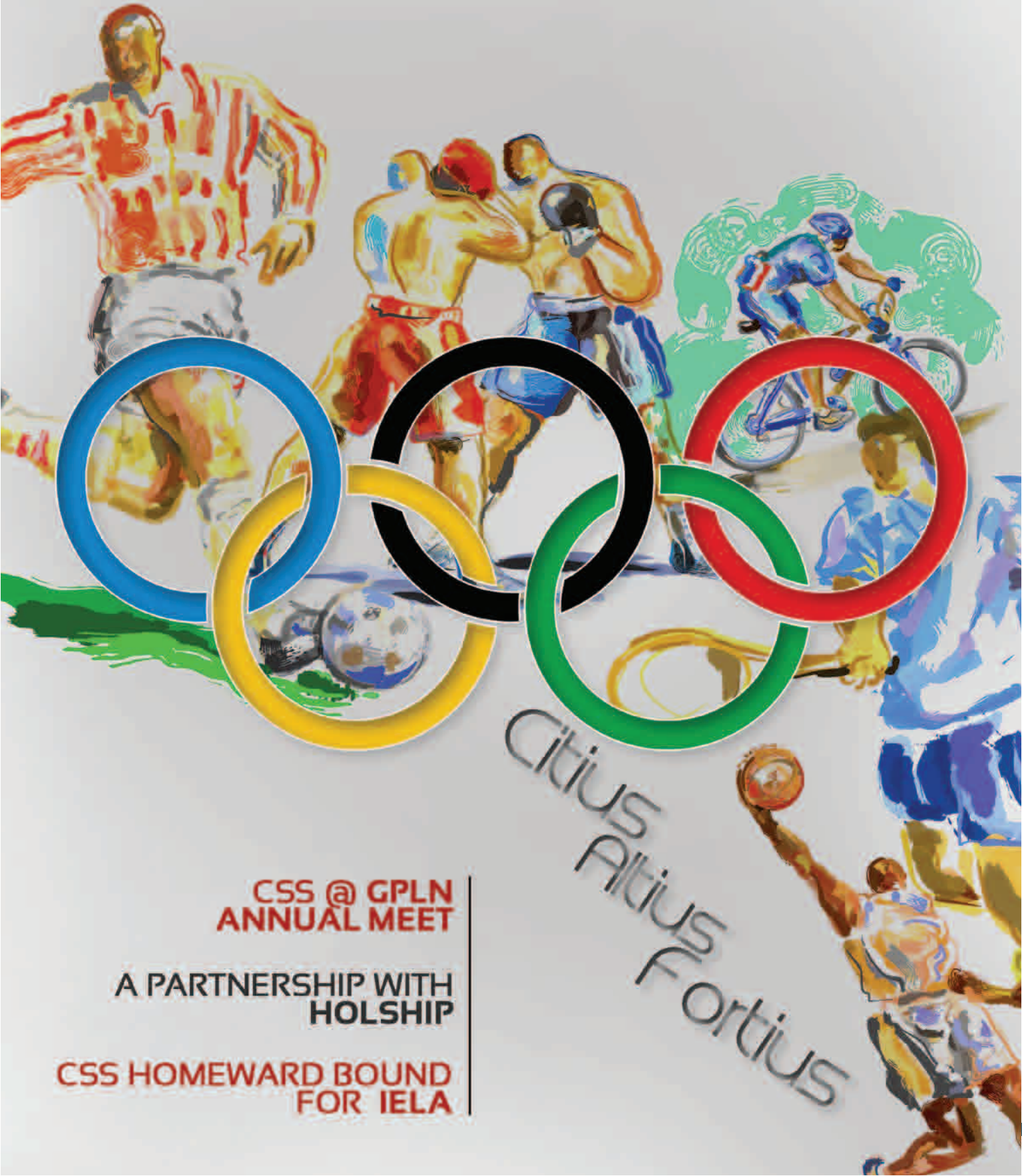

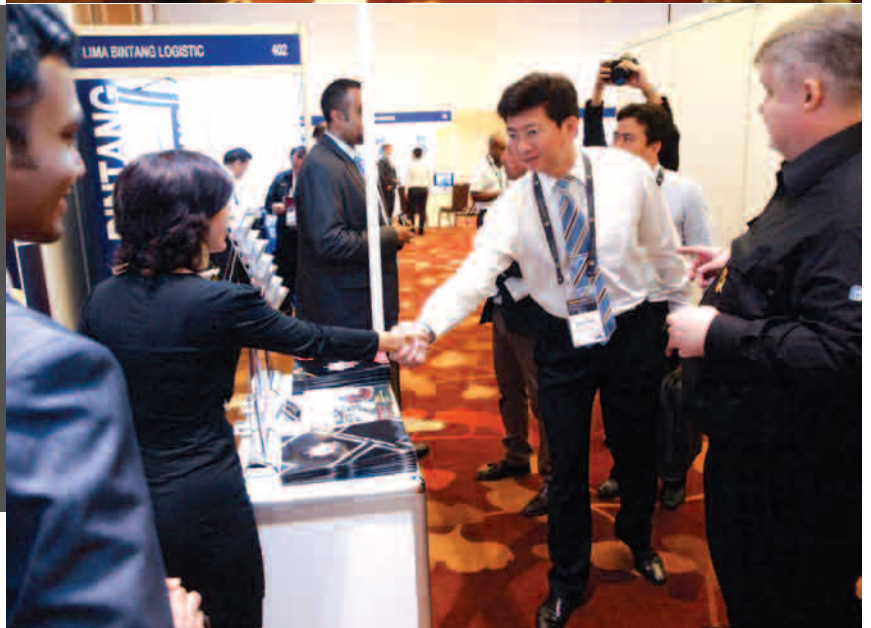

roughly 745 CBM and was successfully handled by the projects team at the prime location. The shipment was executed as per schedule while ensuring maximum client satisfaction.



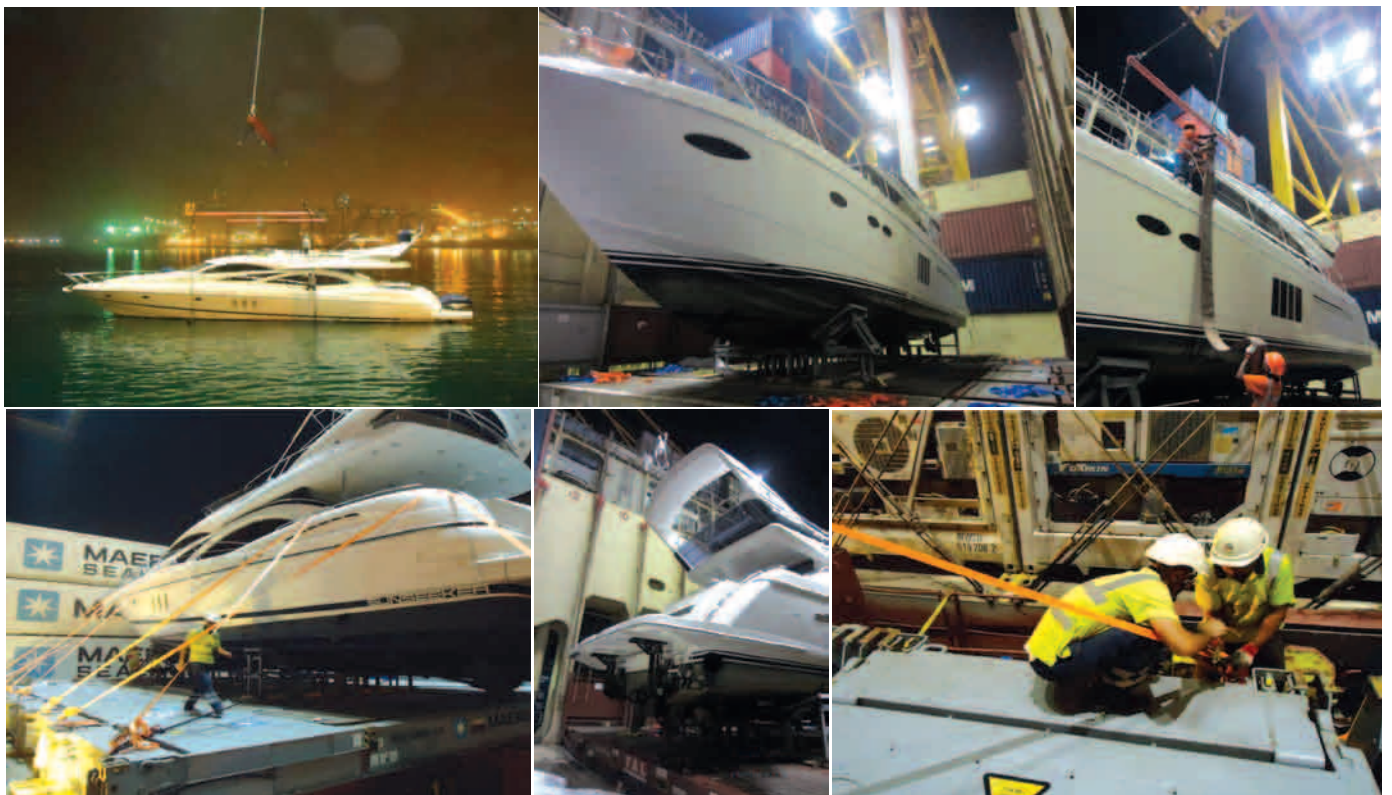
YACHT MOVEMENT

DP WORLD REPORTS 10% INCREASE IN CONTAINER VOLUMES IN FIRST QUARTER OF 2012

DP World Limited held its Annual General Meeting for the year ended 31 December 2011 recently and World Chairman Sultan Ahmed Bin Sulayem made the following statement regarding trading in the first quarter of 2012.

“Across our global portfolio of marine terminals, DP World has seen a 9.5% increase in gross volumes in the first quarter of 2012 handling 13.8 million TEU (twenty-foot equivalent units). Excluding the contribution from new capacity, like for like growth was 7.4%.

“This growth was driven by an excellent performance in our Asia Pacific and Indian Subcontinent region which reported 14.6% growth in volumes as new capacity across the region supported strong growth across our Asia Pacific portfolio.

Growth in Europe, Middle East and Africa region was 4.4% with a good performance in the Middle East and Africa mitigating the ongoing challenging operating environment in Europe. The Americas and Australia region reported growth of 8.7% driven by a very strong performance in the Americas region.

“Our portfolio of consolidated terminals reported container volumes of 6.6 million TEU. Had our five terminals in Australia not been deconsolidated from the 12

March 2011, underlying growth would have been 5.9% when compared to the same period last year.

“Jebel Ali, UAE has continued to deliver strong volume growth handling 3.2 million TEU in the first three months of the year; 8.5% ahead of the same period last year.

“The global macroeconomic uncertainty has continued into 2012. With our portfolio focused on the faster growing emerging markets and more stable origin and destination (O&D) markets, we remain committed to delivering improved operational and financial performance over 2011”.

Welcome OLYMPICS 2012

- In 1908, the marathon standard had been set at exactly 26 miles. During Olympic marathon in London, it was decided that the royal family needed a better view of the finish line so organizers added an extra 385 yards to the race so the finish line would be in front of the royal box. From then on the distance of the Marathon remains to be "26 miles and 385 yards."
- Swimmer "Michael Phelps" of USA won 8 Gold medals in the 2008 Beijing Olympics. It is the highest number of gold medals ever won by a single person in a single olympics game.
- "Abebe Bikila" of Ethiopia won the marathon in 1960 Rome Olympics by registering a record time of 2hrs 15mins and 16.2 secs. He ran this marathon bare footed. He also became the first african to win an olympic gold medal.
- "Berlin Olympics" held in 1936 were the first Olympic games ever to be broadcast on television.
- Romanian "Nadia Comaneci" was the first gymnast to score a perfect 10 seven times in a row. She achieved



London has hosted the Olympic Games on two past occasions, in 1908 and 1948, with a third scheduled for 2012. The planned 2012 Summer Olympics will make London the first city to have hosted the modern Games of three Olympiads. London is the only city in the United Kingdom to have ever hosted the Olympics; the United States is the only country to have hosted Summer Olympics on more occasions than the UK. There are some interesting facts from the history of Olympic Games, which you might not know.

this feat in the 1976 Montreal Games.

- "Hilda Lorna Johnstone" of Great Britain is the oldest women to have ever participated in Olympics till

date. She was 70 years old when she participated in 1972 games. She was an Equestrian.

- There were "no women" participants in the Athens olympics which were held in 1896. First time the women were allowed to participate was in the year 1900 summer olympics held in Paris.
- "Charlotte Cooper" was the first women to win gold medal in the olympics. She won it in the sport of tennis, during the 2nd olympics held in Paris in the year 1900. It was the first olympics in which women participated.
- "Oscar Swahn" of Sweden is the oldest olympian to have participated in any of the olympic events so far. He was a shooter who participated at the 1920 Antwerp Games at the age of 72 years.
- "Dimitrios Loundras" was the youngest olympian ever to participate in modern olympics. He was a Greek gymnast, who competed in the 1896 Athens Olympics. He was 10 years and 218 days old. He remains to be the youngest medallist and competitor in any of the olympics till date.
- "James Connolly" of USA was the first person to win a medal in the first modern olympics held in athens 1896. The winners were given a silver medal and olive leaf.



SOME FACTS ABOUT THE LONDON OLYMPICS 2012

- 26 Olympic sports will be played .
- 19 Paralympic sports will be played.
- The London economy is projected to grow by \$80 billion by 2015.
- The Games are projected to generate 12,000 new jobs in the Olympic Park.
- 31 competition venues will be utilised.
- 20,000 press/media will be in attendance.
- 10km of new roads will be built.
- There will be 500,000 spectators per day.
- 9,000 new homes will be built.
- There will be 9.6million tickets for sale – 8million for the Olympics and 1.6million for the Paralympics.
- Organisers say 75 per cent of all tickets will cost less than £50 and offer free travel on London transport.
- A sell-out rate of 82 per cent for the Olympic Games and 63 per cent for the Paralympics is estimated.
- Tickets for the athletics will start at £15 and there will be 20,000 £10 tickets for the Olympic Park to watch.
- The village will be converted into 3,600 apartments, most of them will be affordable housing.
- After the Games four arenas would be 'deconstructed' and relocated to other parts of the UK along with the swimming pools that are used for water polo and the 50m training pools.
- Charities will be given the sports equipment used in the Games for free.
- 93 per cent of training venues are to be within 30 minutes of the athletes village.
- There are 9,000 planned park and ride spaces to be made available at Ebbfleet where spectators can board a 10-minute javelin service to the Olympic Park.
- It is predicted that on event days 78 per cent of spectators are likely to travel from within London and 22 per cent from the rest of the UK and Europe.

TRADITIONALLY COUNTRY

Every country enjoys a party and usually the larger the better. The most popular ones are usually those which have developed traditionally. In India it may be a festival, Brazil a carnival, France a pageant, Canada a rodeo and in mid USA a hoedown. The names have all been adopted by others and are now common place. However the quintessential event in my home country, England, is still fairly unique which is probably why the opening ceremony of the Olympic Games is focusing on England's countryside. An English Country Show is an event which reflects the farming roots of the past and usually features animals, produce, crafts, skills and lots of family entertainment for all ages. The only other thing needed for success, is something on which we can never rely, good weather.

The size of a country showground ranges from a few acres to many over 40 acres. One showground has up to 250 acres! To visualise this, 9

acres is about the size of 6 football pitches. The most popular ones are in the grounds of stately homes like Royal Sandringham, Chatsworth, Burghley, Bowood and Broadlands, the ancestral home of Lord Mountbatten.

Provided the weather is fine there is an eclectic mix of animals, sheep, cattle, dogs, birds, ferrets, rabbits, hens, horses and fishing. A typical angling area can cover several acres, along a river or beside a lake. Visitors are able to get free coaching in casting techniques. Original bamboo rods, which many professionals consider better than the modern fibre rods, are worth over a \$1500. Add to this craft exhibitors, archery, target sports and game shooting along with walking stick makers, wood carvers and potters casting their clay and it becomes easier to appreciate that the whole showground is buzzing with real live country things "before your very eyes."

Food also plays an important part because, years ago, farmers had to provide everything. You can see fruit and vegetables, cheese and honey vying easily alongside meat and dairy produce. There is always highly fought competition to show off the best and win top awards because gaining the top accolade can increase sales enormously.

In complete contrast in the main arena, shepherds with their flocks of sheep and sheep dogs, have competitions to see who can round up, collect and guide their flock around various obstacles in the shortest time. This is one display which can take place whatever the weather. Neither man nor beast is troubled by it as the shepherd's job is 24/7 on the farm, in all sorts of weather.

Similarly ponies and horses have driving and riding trials. Horses and ponies, what is the difference you might ask? Well ponies are up to 14.2 hands in height where a hand is 4 inches. Anything higher is a horse! Unlike the tranquil sheep these displays are much faster, where riding the course and carrying out tasks, must be done at great speed. The difference between riding and driving is that the former are on the steed and the latter have a type of cart in which the driver sits with a groom, in order to drive the ponies round the course. None of this is as easy as it looks because the role of the groom is to lean into the turns in order to stop the cart or carriages tipping over. No one wants to become a member of the, aptly named infamous, "Tip-up Club". The "gates" through which the riders and drivers have to pass are carefully measured so that there is only a 4 inch clearance. If you knock a gate cone, off falls a marker ball, and time penalties are added to your overall time. You may gather how close things become because the digital timers measure to 100th seconds.

The birds of prey, falcons, hawks and eagles are always amazing. When you see them in action you readily appreciate their swift beauty. They can swoop at up to 100 miles an hour. When I present the commentary, I always ask the spectators not to waive any food as the birds will swoop and seize it before they realise!

Hopefully this brief article has given you a taste for the real thing and you'll be able to watch the Olympics Opening Ceremony with greater understanding and enjoyment. It should be really interesting to see how film producer Danny Boyle is able to translate this ethos into the Olympic stadium - a celebration of the English Countryside.
